


# How to read my prescription drug label

When using any medication it's very important to carefully read the prescription drug label. A typical drug label that a pharmacy puts on your medication may contain the following information. This is being supplied for informational purposes only and to facilitate your understanding of the information that may be contained on the label. This example is by no means an exhaustive list of the possible information contained on all your prescription drug package labels. Note, the information provided on the prescription drug label may differ depending on the pharmacy you go to or by the province you reside in so your actual label may look different. Consult your pharmacist or doctor if you have any questions about the information on your prescription label.
